## Shavuot 2016 Pastor Greg Stone June 3, 2016

Leviticus 23:4 (NKJV) – These *are* the feasts of the L-RD, holy convocations which you shall proclaim at their appointed times. <sup>5</sup> On the <u>fourteenth day</u> of the first month at twilight *is* the L-RD's Passover.

Leviticus 23:11 (NKJV) – He shall wave the sheaf before the L-RD, to be accepted on your behalf; on the day after the Sabbath the priest shall wave it.

Exodus 23:16-17 (NKJV) – <sup>16</sup> On the first day *there shall be* a holy convocation, and on the seventh day there shall be a holy convocation for you. No manner of work shall be done on them.... <sup>17</sup> So <u>you shall observe</u> *the Feast of* Unleavened Bread.

Leviticus 23:15-16 (NKJV) - <sup>15</sup> 'And <u>you shall</u> count for yourselves from the day after the Sabbath, from the day that you brought the sheaf of the wave offering: <u>seven Sabbaths</u> shall be completed. <sup>16</sup> <u>Count fifty days</u> to the day after the seventh Sabbath; then you shall offer a new grain offering to the L-RD.

"This is the 41<sup>st</sup> day, making six weeks and six days of the Omer."

Ezekiel 37:4 (NKJV) – <sup>4</sup> Then he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones and say to them, 'Dry bones, hear the word of the L-RD!

Ezekiel 37: 7-9 (NKJV) – <sup>7</sup> So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I was prophesying, there was a noise, a rattling sound, and the bones came together, bone to bone. <sup>8</sup> I looked, and tendons and flesh appeared on them and skin covered them, but there was no breath in them. <sup>9</sup> Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath…

## I. Shavuot, Chapter One.

- Passover starts eve of Nisan 14. (1<sup>st</sup> month has 30 days)
- Iyar (2<sup>nd</sup> month) 29 days.
- 15 + 29 = 44 days
- Sivan (3<sup>rd</sup> month) Shavuot is Sivan 6

<u>Day 45</u> – Exodus 19:1 (NKJV) – In the <u>third month</u> after the children of Israel had gone out of the land of Egypt, <u>on the same day</u>, they came *to* the Wilderness of Sinai. [Sivan 1]

<u>Day 46</u> – Exodus 19:3 (NKJV) – And <u>Moses went up to G-d</u>, and the L-RD called to him from the mountain, saying, "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the children of Israel.

<u>Day 47</u> – Exodus 19:7-8 (NKJV) –  $^7$  <u>So Moses came and called for the elders of the people</u>, and laid before them all these words which the L-RD commanded him.  $^8$  Then all the people answered together and said, "All that the L-RD has spoken we will do." So Moses brought back the words of the people to the L-RD.

<u>Day 48-49-50</u> – Exodus 19:9-11 (NKJV) – <sup>9</sup> And the L-RD said to Moses, "Behold, I come to you in the thick cloud, that the people may hear when I speak with you, and believe you forever." So Moses told the words of the people to the L-RD. <sup>10</sup> Then the L-RD said to Moses, "Go to the people and consecrate them today and tomorrow, and let them wash their clothes. <sup>11</sup> And let them be ready for the third day. For on the third day the L-RD will come down upon Mount Sinai in the sight of all the people.

Exodus 19:16 (NKJV) – Then it came to pass on the third day, in the morning, that there were thunderings and lightnings, and a thick cloud on the mountain; and the sound of the trumpet was very loud, so that all the people who *were* in the camp trembled.

Exodus 19:18-19 (NKJV) - <sup>18</sup> Now Mount Sinai *was* completely in smoke, because the L-RD descended upon it in fire. Its smoke ascended like the

smoke of a furnace, and the whole mountain quaked greatly. <sup>19</sup> And when the blast of the trumpet sounded long and became louder and louder, Moses spoke, and G-d answered him by voice.

I am the L-RD your G-d, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. You shall have no other G-ds before Me. (Exodus 20:2-3, KJV)

You shall not make for yourself a carved image—any likeness *of anything* that *is* in heaven above, or that *is* in the earth beneath, or that *is* in the water under the earth; you shall not bow down to them nor serve them. For I, the L-RD your G-d, *am* a jealous G-d, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth *generations* of those who hate Me, but showing mercy to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments. (Exodus 20:4-6, NKJV)

You shall not take the name of the L-RD your G-d in vain, for the L-RD will not hold *him* guiltless who takes His name in vain. (Exodus 20:7, NKJV)

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. (Exodus 20:8, NKJV)

Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long upon the land which the L-RD your G-d is giving you. (Exodus 20:12, NKJV)

You shall not murder. (Exodus 20:13, NKJV)

You shall not commit adultery. (Exodus 20:14, NKJV)

You shall not steal. (Exodus 20:15, NKJV)

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. (Exodus 20:16, NKJV)

You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his male servant, nor his female servant, nor his ox, nor his donkey, nor anything that *is* your neighbor's." (Exodus 20:17, NKJV)

Exodus 20:18 (NKJV) – All the people witnessed the thunderings, the lightning flashes, the sound of the trumpet, and the mountain smoking; and when the people saw *it*, they trembled and stood afar off.

Exodus 32:1 (NKJV) – When the people saw that Moses delayed coming down from the mountain, the people gathered together to Aaron, and said to him, "Come, make us G-ds that shall go before us; for *as for* this Moses, the man who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him."

## II. Shavuot, Chapter 2.

1 Corinthians 15:20 (NKJV) – But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Acts 1:4 (NKJV) – He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father.

Acts 1:8 (NKJV) – "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

Acts 2:1 (NKJV) – When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place.

Acts 2:2-4 (NKJV) – <sup>2</sup> Suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup> Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and *one* sat upon each of them. <sup>4</sup> And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Jeremiah 31:31-33 (NKJV)

31 "Behold, the days are coming, says the L-RD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah—<sup>32</sup> not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers in the day that I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt, My covenant which they broke, though I was a husband to them, says the L-RD. <sup>33</sup> But this *is* the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the L-RD: I will put My law in their minds, and write it on their hearts; and I will be their G-d, and they shall be My people.

## III. Shavuot, Chapter Three.
