And the people complained against Moses, saying, "What shall we drink?"

1Cor.10:1-13

Moreover, brethren, I do not want you to be unaware that all our fathers were under the cloud, all passed through the sea, all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea,

- 3 all ate the same spiritual food,
- 4 and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank of that spiritual Rock that followed them, and that Rock was Messiah.
- 5 But with most of them G-d was not well pleased, for *their bodies* were scattered in the wilderness.
- 6, 10 Now these things became our examples, to the intent that we should not... complain, as some of them also complained, and were destroyed by the destroyer.

1. G-d Heals You by Turning Every Bitter Thing Sweet

Ex.15:25

So he (Moses) cried out to the L-rd, and the L-rd showed him a tree. When he cast *it* into the waters, the waters were made sweet. There He made a statute and an ordinance for them, and there He tested them,

Num. 21:8-9

Then the L-rd said to Moses, "Make a fiery *serpent*, and set it on a pole; and it shall be that everyone who is bitten, when he looks at it, shall live."

9 So Moses made a bronze serpent, and put it on a pole; and so it was, if a serpent had bitten anyone, when he looked at the bronze serpent, he lived.

2. G-d Heals Every Sickness and Disease

Ex.15:26

and said, "If you diligently heed the voice of the L-rd your G-d and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have brought on the Egyptians. For I *am* the L-rd who heals you."

Ps. 107:5-6, 19-20

- 5 Hungry and thirsty, Their soul fainted in them.
- 6 Then they cried out to the L-rd in their trouble, *And* He delivered them out of their distresses.
- 19 Then they cried out to the L-rd in their trouble, *And* He saved them out of their distresses.
- 20 He sent His word and healed them, And delivered *them* from their destructions.
