Focus God wants us to share our story with others. When we reach out to others we see lives changed. Jesus encouraged people to “come and see.”

Review Key Scriptures: John 1–4

1. Just talk to people.

Conversation is the open door to relationship. The start of a new friendship may be a simple, “Hello.” Friendship can open the door to sharing your testimony.

2. Just invite people.

Jesus drew people into relationship. He invited those around Him to “come and see.” When we do likewise, the result can be a transformed life.

3. Just witness to people.

When you share what you have seen or heard, your story can be a witness to others. Be open to opportunities to tell others what Jesus has done in your life.

Group Dynamics Idea God does not want anyone to perish. Ask Him to show you a lost person in your family, office, or neighborhood to specifically pray for this week.

Discuss

1. Everyone’s salvation story is different. What is your salvation story?
2. If you have shared your salvation story before, what was the result?

3. In John 1:39, Jesus says, “Come and see.” How can we apply these words today?
4. Identify the common theme in Luke 7:22; John 3:32; and Acts 4:20, 22:15. What have you *seen or heard* that could be shared with others?
5. Do you remember the first time you invited someone to church? What was your experience?
6. Explain what it means to give God control over your life.

Take Home As we conclude, remember the following:

- We all have a story.
- There are people we can encourage by sharing our story.
- Lives can be transformed when we invite people to “come and see.”

Prayer Father, You have changed my life. I want others to meet You too. Help me to share my story with someone who needs to know You. Show me who to ask to come to church with me. I ask You to prepare this person’s heart to say, “Yes.” In Jesus’ name, Amen.
