Focus Christianity is the only worldview that cohesively answers the questions of: origin, meaning, morality, and destiny. Saying God doesn't exist requires having all knowledge, which is impossible. Saying God does exist requires having a relationship with Him, which is possible. If you know God, you can say with certainty that He exists.

Review Key Scripture: Psalm 14:1

1. **There is a correct worldview.**

A worldview is a lens through which you view the world. A worldview must address these points: origin (How did I get here?), meaning (Why am I here?), morality (How do I define good and evil?), and destiny (What happens to me after death?). While other worldviews try, Christianity is the only one that consistently and coherently addresses all four points.

2. **There is no atheist.**

It is scientifically impossible to be an atheist. To scientifically say there is no God, you have to possess all knowledge. You can say you don't know whether or not there is a God, but it's impossible to say you know for a fact there is no God.

3. **There is a God.**

Think about your best friend. If someone said your best friend does not exist, they would have to have met every person in the world. But if you have personally met and know your best friend, you can say without a shadow of a

doubt that your best friend exists. If you know God, you can say with certainty that He exists.

Discuss

1. Have you ever stopped to think about your worldview? Which aspects of your worldview are you most confident about? Which aspects are you least confident about?
2. One of the key points a worldview must address is how humanity came to exist, and that is a point that has been hotly debated. Why do you think that is?
3. How does knowing God personally help you understand why you are here on earth?
4. Some people say that morality is subjective; it can be different from person to person. Why is that a flawed argument?
5. Before you came to know God, did you consider yourself an atheist or an agnostic? If so, what caused you to change your perspective?
6. While talking about your own experience of knowing God, why is it important to be respectful and compassionate to people who don't know God?
7. Are there people in your life who don't yet know God but need to? How can you be a positive example and a light to them?

Take Home As we conclude, remember the following:

- There is only one correct worldview.
- It is impossible to be an atheist.
- There is a God.
