Focus

God knows everything, but He loves knowing *you* the most. God is everywhere because He doesn't want to miss one second with you. Don't settle for having an intellectual relationship with God; have an intimate relationship with Him. God passionately loves us and invites us to know Him intimately.

Review Key Scriptures: Matthew 26:6–13; Psalm 139:1–10

1. Intimacy has a completely different way of seeing.

God wants to know us intimately. The Bible says God's sheep hear His voice. God speaks to us daily, but the question is whether we are listening. God loves us more than we will ever know, and He wants us to learn His ways so we can know Him. The greatest growth we will experience as believers is when our knowledge of God moves from our heads to our hearts. In the Bible, God shows us how to see Him and reveals how He sees us. Ask God to help you see Him more intimately.

2. Intimacy has a completely different way of speaking.

Intimacy speaks to us like a child, like a friend, and like a lover. Best friends know everything about each other. God invites us to be best friends with Him. Eternal life is an invitation to spend forever with God in an intimate relationship. God wants to be known by us in a way no one else knows. If we boast about anything, we should boast that we truly know God and understand He is the Lord who demonstrates and declares His intimate love for us. God is in love with us, and we were created to be lovers of God.

- 6. Intimacy with God should change how we hear Him. How might you hear God differently in your everyday life through the lens of intimacy?
- 7. What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through this message?
