Discuss

- 1. How has going to church been like green pastures and still waters in your life?
- 2. Why is it important to let God fill your tank every day and not just on the weekend? What does this look like for you?
- 3. What are indications that your tank is empty?
- 4. Read Luke 4:18 and Matthew 12:20. What do these verses reveal about the character of Jesus? What are some ways God has brought freedom and victory in your life?
- 5. If you're comfortable, share about a time you were in a pit and Jesus, the Good Shepherd, got you out of it.
- 6. How does walking in paths of righteousness affect your life?
- 7. Can you think of a time you heard God and were filled with confidence? Why does hearing God help us to live confidently?
- 8. Laying down in green pastures and sitting beside still waters requires time. What changes do you need to make to ensure you are spending enough time with the Lord, our Shepherd?
- 9. What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through this message?
