Key Scriptures: Ephesians 4:11–12; 1 John 1:1–3; John 9:6–27

Discuss

1. How would you describe an evangelist?
2. Can you think of one or two well-known evangelists? What stands out to you about them?
3. What is a “witness”? How can you be a witness in your everyday life?
4. How do evangelists equip people to be a witness?
5. Who was a witness to you before you were saved? What was it about their life or what they said that impacted you?
6. Pastor Robert shared that we all have a story about what God did for us. What is your story?
7. What keeps us from being a witness to others? How can we overcome those barriers?
8. Have you shared your faith with others? If so, what has been your experience?
9. What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through this message?

Takeaway

As we conclude, remember the following:

- Evangelists are messengers with good news.
- Witnessing is simply telling your story.
- We all have a story to tell about what God has done.

Prayer

Heavenly Father, thank You for the gifts of Jesus. All of us have seen and heard and experienced Your goodness and mercy. Help us boldly testify of how You have saved and

Leader Tip

At the end of your group, divide everyone into smaller subgroups to pray for one another. Ask those subgroups to continue to pray for each other and communicate throughout the week. Pick someone to be in charge of writing down prayer requests and communicating them to everyone in the subgroup.

Group Dynamics Idea

This week's message was a powerful reminder that we all have a story to tell of what we have seen and heard God do. Engage your group in a fun exercise where you give everyone one to two minutes to "witness" or tell of what God has done for them. This is a practical tool to build confidence and it can also help the group connect on a deeper level.
