Key Scriptures: 2 Peter 1:4; Exodus 19:5; Deuteronomy 28:15

Discuss

- 1. What did Pastor Robert mean when he said we are fully human but partially divine?
- 2. Pastor Robert discussed the Suzerain-Vassal Treaty which was an agreement between a lord and a servant (usually a stronger nation and a weaker nation). How does the Old Covenant God made with Israel reflect this?
- 3. How do we often see ourselves in a Suzerain-Vassal type of relationship with God? How does this mindset hinder us from being and doing all God has called us to?
- 4. What are some ways we tend to relate to God with an if-then mindset?
- 5. Pastor Robert discussed a Parity Treaty (one often made by two equally powerful nations). How does the covenant God made between Himself and Jesus reflect this type of agreement?
- 6. Read Romans 4:3. How is righteousness attributed to our account?
- 7. Read Genesis 17:2–4. What was unique about the way God made a covenant with Abraham? How does it parallel the covenant God made with us?
- 8. Why do we easily count ourselves out when we only see the limitations and weaknesses of our humanity?
- 9. What area of ministry would you want to serve in if you really believed God could use your partially divine nature?
- 10. What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through this message?

Takeaway

As we conclude, remember the following:

- The Old Covenant was based on our works.
- The New Covenant is based on Jesus' finished work.

Leader Tip
