Key Scriptures: Luke 10:38–42; Luke 8:1–3; 2 Corinthians 4:18

Discuss

- 1. Would you say you are more of a task-oriented person or a people-oriented person?
- 2. When stress starts to pile up, how do you typically respond? Do you busy yourself with things to do or do you get quiet?
- 3. How does our view of eternity affect the way we live or handle stress?
- 4. What did Pastor Robert mean when he said Christians "move" instead of saying they die?
- 5. If you got quiet and *thought about* what you *think about*, would you say your thoughts are more directed toward what is eternal or what is temporal? If you feel comfortable, share an example.
- 6. Read 1 Corinthians 15:55. How do you feel when you read this verse? What new thoughts do you have about life and death?
- 7. Have you ever done a *human* thing only to see later how God turned it into something divine? What happened?
- 8. What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through this message?

Takeaway

As we conclude, remember the following:

- Be still and know He is God.
- Live with an eternal mindset.
- God can turn your humanity into something divine.

Leader Tip

Getting to know your group members is important, but some people are more reserved than others and have a harder time sharing. Consider setting aside time in one of your groups for everyone to share for two minutes about themselves—what they do for a living or what hobbies they have. Some people will want to over share, so set the ground rules. Let them know they have two minutes to share, set a time, and give them a warning when they have 10 seconds left to wrap up. This is a great way to get to know everyone and keep the group on track to share.

Group Dynamics Idea

Have you seen *Jesus Revolution* yet? Even if you have, this would be a great outing for your group to do together! Encourage everyone to invite one unchurched friend or neighbor to attend with you. This is a great evangelism opportunity and way to grow your group. After the movie, you could invite the new people to attend your next group gathering and talk about the movie together.
